

The Foster Grandparent Program is a nationwide volunteer program for seniors. Participants offer one-on-one support to children and youth.

As part of the Ozarks Area Community Action Corporation (OACAC), the Foster Grandparent Program gives persons 55 years and older the chance to share their talents, love and encouragement to at-risk children in their communities.

OACAC Foster Grandparents serve at volunteer stations in a fourteen-county area of Southwest Missouri.

Who are Foster Grandparents?

A Volunteer in the program does many of the things a grandparent would do with their own grandchildren. Playing, loving, laughing and listening are experiences shared between Foster Grandparents and children. They also help teachers with tutoring, therapy, developing motor skills and other classroom activities. Many times they serve as a role model for children or teens who do not have the opportunity to share time with their own grandparents.
