## A Focus On Housing & Utilities

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) assists low-income households with paying their utility bills.

# 14,826

Households received Energy Assistance, reducing the risk of health and safety problems that arise from unsafe heating and cooling situations and practices.

# 6,815

Households received winter Energy Crisis assistance, ensuring their homes were warm when temperatures dropped.

In 2022, we partnered the Discovery Center School and Republic Senior Centers to build Tower Farms - the first ever in the world!

Head Start is staffed by qualified professionals, many with degrees in Early Childhood Education or a related field. More than 27% of staff are current or former Head Start parents.



# HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

## Providing safe, affordable housing

The OACAC Housing Assistance Program has administered the HUD tenant-based Section 8 program since 1978, beginning as the Dallas County Public Housing Agency.

This program is administered in the OACAC 10-county service area with the exception of inside Springfield city limits, served by HAS Properties.

The program helps approved income-eligible households pay a portion of their rent in a home which is safe, decent and sanitary. The rental unit must also be determined to be rent reasonable based on comparable unassisted units in the area.

## SHELTER PLUS CARE

The HUD Shelter Plus Care for Disabled Homeless individuals program serves the Branson area, as well as Springfield and Greene, Christian, and Webster counties. Funds are provided by Missouri Department of Mental Health (DMH).



## SEEKING PROPERTY OWNERS

If you own modestly priced rental housing in SW MO and would like to participate in the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program, we welcome you.





# LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIHEAP)

Assisting households with their energy related crisis

## Energy Assistance (EA)

- A one-time payment per year for one fuel type
- The program runs from October - September
- Eligibility is based on household size & income
- Applicants must apply for EA before being considered for ECIP

## Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP)

- Assistance to alleviate energy-related crises
- Winter ECIP operates from October - May
- The ECIP Summer Cooling Program is available from June - September



## Project SHARE

- A City Utilities program in partnership with OACAC which helps seniors and families maintain utilities
- The program runs January - May

*Keeping people warm in the winter, cool in the summer.*

## LIHWAP

- The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) assists with a one-time payment for water and/or wastewater (sewer) bill. The program runs October – September.



# WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



## Energy efficiency services for homeowners and renters

The Weatherization Assistance Program reduces the energy burden on low-income residents by installing cost-effective energy efficiency measures and ensuring health and safety.

### Weatherization services include:

- Insulation of attic, floors and walls
- Weather stripping
- Repairs to doors and windows
- Gas heating systems and appliances tested for safety and efficiency
- Air sealing

### Benefits include:

- Reduced energy usage
- Increased home energy efficiency
- Long-term energy savings

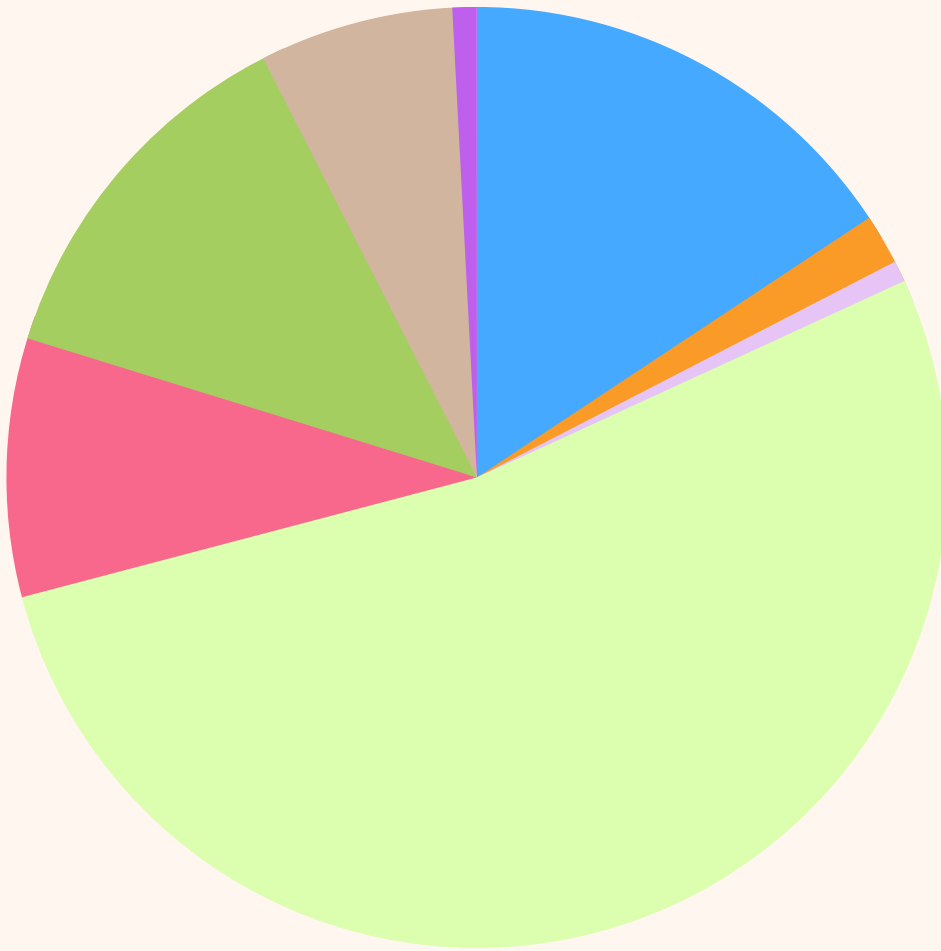
## OACAC GRANTS AWARDED

The OACAC Grant Assistance Fund is comprised of donations and fundraising proceeds. Grants were awarded to agency programs, helping fill gaps not funded by other sources.

- Weatherization received \$3,000 to make home repairs
- CSBG received \$3,000 for the Billings Holiday Shop and PTA partnership, as well as \$3,000 to expand Mental Health First Aid
- Foster Grandparent Program received \$3,000 for a volunteer recognition and 50th anniversary celebration
- Family Planning received \$3,000 to purchase necessary medications provided to patients with no income, insurance, or ability to pay

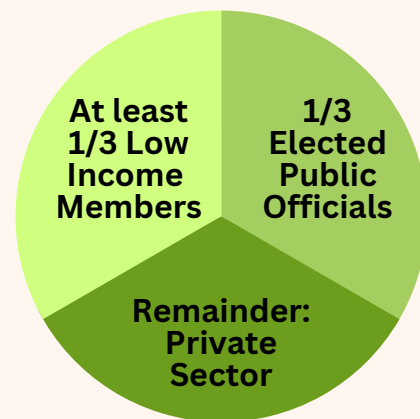

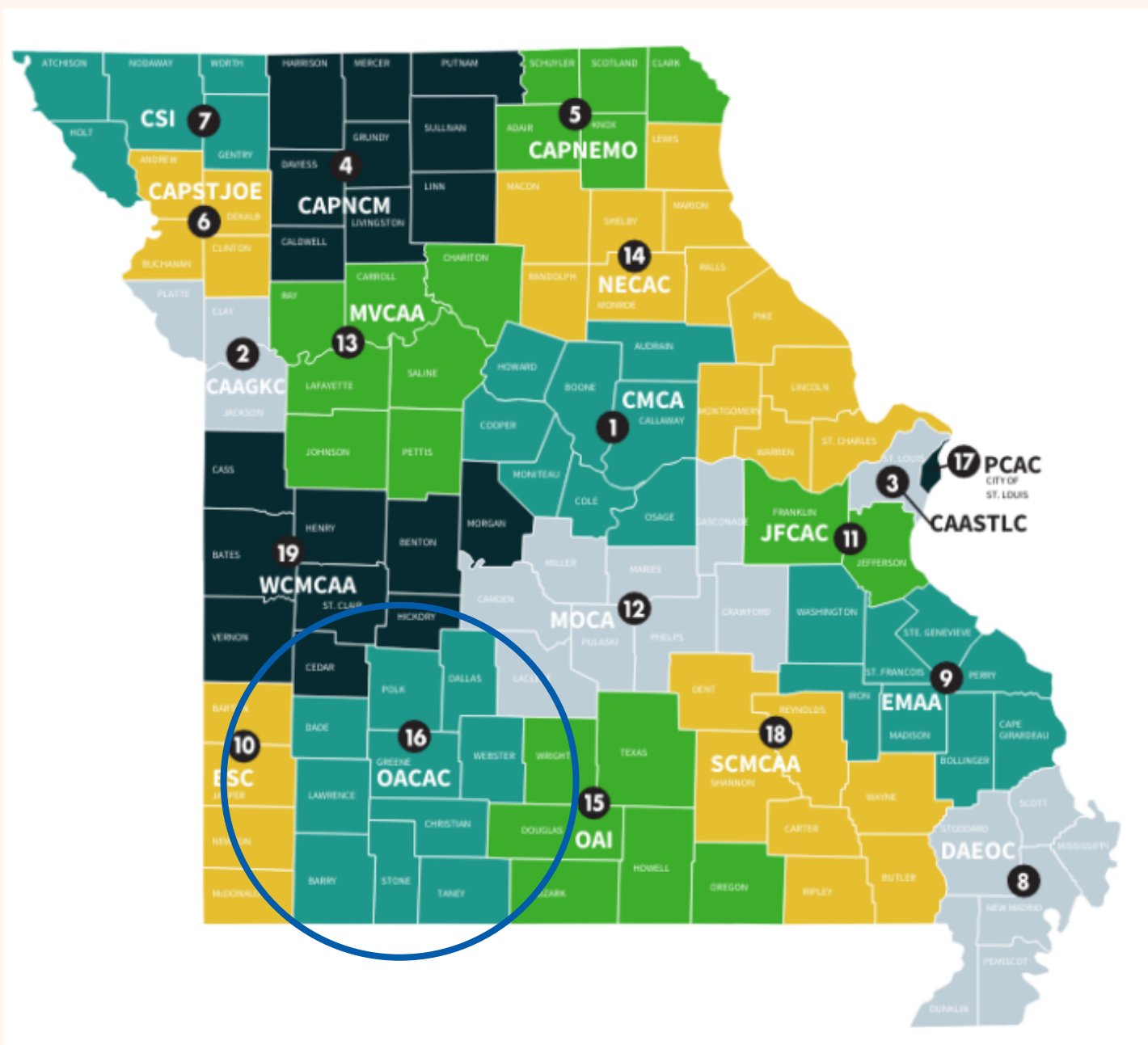
